Ashley Hall is pleased to announce the Ethel Mae Hocker Scholarship for the 2017-2018 academic year. We invite applications from girls new to the Ashley Hall community entering grades six through nine who possess a consistent record of academic achievement equal to a 3.2 GPA or higher, are committed to community service, and qualify for significant financial assistance. The winning candidate will receive an award from the Ethel Mae Hocker Foundation equal to the cost of tuition each year for her entire academic career at Ashley Hall provided that she maintains the required academic and service record. The winning candidate will be responsible for school fees outside of tuition.

Mr. and Mrs. Richard Hocker founded the Ethel Mae Hocker Foundation to inspire scholarship opportunities for talented students who are prepared to excel scholastically and to demonstrate leadership in academically rigorous schools. Successful applicants possess a consistent record of academic achievement, a commitment to community service, and demonstrated financial need. The successful candidate must maintain this commitment to her academics and community service throughout her Ashley Hall career.

### **The successful candidate will have the following completed by June 15, 2017**

- Transcripts indicating grades earned in the last three consecutive academic years.
- Classroom and administrator recommendations from the most recent academic term.
- Test scores from one of the following: the Independent School Entrance Exam, Secondary School Admission Test, or the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test.
- A copy of the candidate's birth certificate.
